# MANAGERS MESSAGE

## AUGUST, THE MONTH OF THE EXPECTED AND UNEXPECTED

Augustwasanexciting month full of both the expected and the unexpected.

For the expected we had our last two summer concerts. The closing concert Woodstock Festival was a great

finish to the concert season with classic music and good vibes. The sunset was amazing to the West as Tropical Storm Hilary crept up on us from the South. But the weather held for us on this great day of music as Nellie Gail Ranch families gathered again in Gallup Park.



The unexpected tropical storm caused us all some concern as we typically place sandbags in October in preparation for the rainy season. Fortunately Boulder Earthwork was able to source and place 2,000 sandbags on the most vulnerable of our trails and we had minimal runoff despite the 2.25" of steady rainfall. The wind gave us a good early test of our tree maintenance program. While we had a lot of debris on Monday morning we only lost a few smaller trees and were able to re-stake a number of others.

The early rain also gave us a good test of our regraded trail by Dapple Grey Park. This section of trail was a past boggy mess after heavy rains but a grading project we implemented this spring resulted in much improved flow of water. It dried and was rideable within two days. A clubhouse roof leak repair was also confirmed resolved and the buckets and towels were able to remain in closets.

It is gratifying to see investments in maintenance and proactive care pay off when challenging times arrive! But the real fun is witnessing Nellie Gail Ranch homeowners gather together for shared enjoyment of music. The weekend of August 19th and 20th brought both of those sentiments together.

#### SAFEGUARDING YOUR HOME

Homeowners are encouraged to remain ever vigilant in safeguarding homes from potential burglary. With the change in seasons from summer to fall you may find your family schedule changes too and you may be home or away in different patterns than the summer. It is a good time to re-assess your personal home security. The following are some tips for seeking ways to "harden the target" to make your home a less likely target.

- 1. Walk around your home surveying with the eyes of a burglar to scout for easy access. While the direct approach from the front of the home is most apparent, pay particular attention also to access from the trail if you have an easement beside or behind your home.
- 2. Consider additional cameras and equestrian safe motion activated warning devices.

- **3.** Maintain landscape to reduce hiding places close to access points to your home.
- **4.** Install second story alarm systems including broken glass.
- 5. Set your alarm anytime you leave your home, even for short times away.
- **6.** Stay active with your current Neighborhood Watch group or consider forming one with your neighbors.

# STORM PREPARDNESS AND STORM SAFETY







#### **NEWS FROM TEAM DARKHORSE**

Early morning of June 13 at Camp Pendleton a small group of Team Darkhorse members unload and set up tables and chairs, and Chairman Vanessa Kon brews a large pot of fresh coffee on her camping stove set inside her Rubicon jeep. We are on the parade deck to bid "fair winds and following seas" to our city's adopted Marines.

Today's group of Darkhorse Marines is the third and final wave to depart.

Two hours before the buses pull in, Marines arrive and mill about the Camp Pendleton parade deck, laughing and chatting, kissing babies and wives, taking photos with girlfriends and stopping by our booth to grab a snack or coffee and say hello. Some of the Marines are familiar — SgtMajor Cornell Cornish comes over and introduces us to his two teenage sons — others are unfamiliar yet friendly and surprised when they see what we are offering them, and why we are there. We are told seeing civilians on base giving support to Marines is unique to Camp Pendleton (and a nice credit to the "OC"!)

One such Marine is 1st Sgt Pete Vargo, who introduces himself and his wife Melissa. He is friendly and engaging , tells us a funny story about bears and country roads, thanks us profusely, and allows us to take their photo. I promise to send it to him, only later to realize I did not have his contact number.

But they are here to deploy, not to linger. And now it is go time.

We watch the Marines move quickly to attention once called to formation. All eyes forward, backs straight, shoulders aligned, one force, superior strength, mission ready. When their Commander calls "Three Five!", in return and louder they echo the Battalion Call, "GET SOME!"

Onto the parade deck behind us have rolled several large buses — which now become beehives of activity — as over 200 Marines load their gear and themselves for departure on the UDP (Unit Deployment Program)

to Okinawa, Japan. (These UDP's to Japan have two purposes, we are told. The first is to "deter and respond " to any crises in the South Seas. These may (and have ) included disaster, rescue and hurricane response. The second is to train for forward deployment with our allies across the Phillippines, Guam, Korea and Mt Fuji.)

The Marines are turned to task, the buses' engines loud, their exhaust strong and spreading, and the last families to linger begin to disperse.

As we pack our gear to go, we reflect upon these Marines, Sailors and their families who stand up, sacrifice and, if called, fight for our nation. Who are these young people who first seek to build strength of self and country, ahead of personal fortune?

In our volunteer roles, we have the privilege of getting to know many of them, which is one of the rewards of volunteering with Team Darkhorse. #### WHAT IS YOUR HOMETOWN?

# **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

#### THE FIRST AID KIT

One of the most important components (after water, food and shelter) of your supplies is your first aid kit. It can mean the difference between being comfortable and confident, or being distressed and fearful. The Nellie Gail Emergency Preparedness Committee strongly encourages you to put together a well thought out, quality kit that will be useful to you and your family. Although one can buy commercially made, pre-fabricated kits, some of the items in the kit may not be useful for your needs; evaluate these kits thoroughly to make sure you are comfortable with all of the items in the kit you purchase.

Many first aid kits will list the items included in the kit, but fail to explain their uses. In this month's article, we will go over in detail the use and importance of each item found in a quality kit. You should note that the quantities mentioned are the minimum quantities that make up a good kit. In addition, do not feel constrained about the items mentioned; you should customize your first aid kit for your family's particular needs.

Ace Bandages™. 3" and 4" widths, one each. Ace bandages are good for wrapping strained joints or for holding trauma pads or stacks of gauze in place. If room permits, a 6" Ace Bandage can be used to hold chest, abdominal or back bandages in place.

**4" x 4" Sterile Gauze (non-adhesive)**. 20-25 pieces. Gauze helps absorb any bleeding and can be used to cover open wounds. Two to three folded in half can also make an effective eye patch.

Non-Stick, Telfa Pad™ 2" x 2". 12-20. Telfa pads are placed next to the wound before placing gauze to minimize the bandage sticking to the wound.

**Trauma Pad 4" x 8". 1-2**. A trauma pad is a very absorbent, sterile gauze that is used on large wounds to the abdomen. They are useful where



there could be significant bleeding. As strange as it may sound, feminine napkins can also be used as trauma pads.

Adhesive Bandaids. 12-20, varying sizes. These are used to cover smaller wounds. Larger Bandaids (2" x 2") will cover smaller scrapes. The new "Liquid Bandaids" can be used but only if you are certain the wound is clean and free of bacteria, dirt, etc. Otherwise, the application of Liquid Bandaids to a dirty wound will likely promote an infection.

**Butterfly Bandages**. 6-10. These are used to temporarily hold together full thickness cuts and lacerations.

Cloth Medical Tape, 2". 1 roll. This tape is used to tape splints or bandages where strength is needed. The cloth tape can also be torn lengthwise to make smaller widths.

Paper Medical Tape, 1". 1 roll. This tape is primarily for taping gauze or bandages to the skin as it is more comfortable on the skin and preferred if you anticipate it being in contact with the skin for a long period of time.

**3" wide gauze roll/Kling**. 3-4 rolls. This non-sterile roll can be used to wrap the 4" x 4" gauze onto an extremity. Wrapping with Kling or a gauze roll

is preferable as it allows for some swelling of the extremity.

Triangular bandage. 2-3. The Triangular bandage can be used to make an arm sling, a tourniquet (see caution below), or to tie a leg splint in place.

Finger/Thumb Splint. 2-3. This is used to immobilize a fractured or dislocated finger, or to immobilize a finger that has been sutured (stitches placed.) Although aluminum is best, popsicle sticks or tongue depressors can also be used.

S.A.M. Splints™. 1-2. The SAM splint™ is a relative new product that can be shaped to splint extremities or even be shaped to make a neck brace.

Cardboard Splints. 1-2 of each size. Alternatively, extremity splints can be made from 8" x 12" and 8" by 16" pieces of cardboard. Make sure the corrugations run in the same direction as the long axis of the splint and make sure there are no folds in the cardboard.

Alcohol pads. 12-20. These pre-packaged square pads can be used to clean or sterilize wounds or to sterilize needles or other medical instruments.

Hydrogen Peroxide. 1 pint. Hydrogen Peroxide is useful for cleaning wounds without causing too much discomfort. Hydrogen Peroxide does expire and looses its effectiveness so it should be rotated in with your home supplies as needed.

Cotton tipped applicators (sterile). 6-12. These are similar to Q-tips but sterile and are used to apply topical medications onto wounds, or they can be useful in removing foreign bodies in wounds and to the eyes and eyelids.

Polysporin Antibiotic Ointment. 1 tube. This is a very effective topical antibiotic ointment for cuts and scrapes. Neosporin is similar but can be irritating to sensitive skin.

hot and cold packs can be very helpful for sprains, strains, insect bites, etc. These packs are "activated" by shaking or breaking the internal bag causing a chemical reaction.

CPR Mask, 1-2. This is a mask or shield used when performing mouth-to-mouth so as to prevent the spread of infections.

Latex or Nitrile Gloves (non-sterile). 1 box of 100. Latex or Nitrile gloves are indispensible (and mandatory) when handling any bloody injuries, body parts, body fluids, waste, etc. Some are sensitive to the powder in the gloves and non-powdered gloves are available.

Sterile Latex Gloves. 1-2 pair. The sterile gloves may be needed for deep, penetrating wounds or for repairing wounds through sutures (stitches.)

Safety Pins. 6-12. The safety pins have many uses including removing splinters, attaching gauze rolls, repairing torn clothing, etc.

Bandage Scissors. 1. The best bandage scissors are known as "paramedic shears" which are easy to handle (no larger than regular scissors) but strong enough to cut denim, zippers, etc. They can even cut a penny in half.

Thermometer. 1. Use for taking accurate temperatures. Have extra batteries if using an electronic thermometer.

Single Edge Razor or Scalpel. 1-2. This will be used by a physician to open wounds, drain abscesses, etc.

Rubber Bands, 6-12. Rubber bands are useful as they can be used hold gauze in place on fingers and smaller extremities, as finger tourniquets (see caution below), hold long hair out of the way, etc.

Tourniquet. 1. When used properly and in the Instant Hot and Cold packs. 2-3 of each. Instant right situation, tourniquets are a very effective

way to stop active bleeding. It should be noted that tourniquet use is appropriate when all other methods or attempts to stop active bleeding have been exhausted. Once in place, it should not be removed except by a medical professional (i.e. it is a myth that a tourniquet should be loosened every few minutes.) Commercially made tourniquets are available but one can easily be made from clothing, belts, neck ties, triangular bandage, thick extension cord, etc. Do not use string, wire, shoelaces, or anything else that can cut into the skin. Proper use and placement of a tourniquet will be covered in a future article.

**Burn Gels. 1 bottle.** Burn gels providing soothing relief, improve healing, and provide protection against infections when applied to burns.

Pain Medications. A small bottle of Tylenol, Motrin and Aspirin are appropriate to have in your kit to help alleviate minor aches and pains. Expiration dates of these and other medications should be watched closely.

**Antacids**. Antacids such as Tums, Mylanta, Zantac and Prilosec (all over-the-counter) can be helpful for acid problems exacerbated by the stress of a disaster.

Anti-diarrheal Medications. Anti-diarrheal medications, such as Imodium (over-the-counter) can be helpful in preventing dehydration in severe cases of diarrhea. It should be avoided, however, if the diarrhea is mild or transient as diarrhea is your body's way of trying to rid itself of something.

**Laxatives.** Stress can slow intestinal transit and lead to constipation. Over-the-counter laxatives (Ex-Lax, etc.) can be helpful for this condition.

QuikClot™. 1-2 packages. QuikClot™ is a new product that helps in the clotting of blood. First used by the Israeli military, it is commercially available as a gauze to safely and effectively stop traumatic bleeding.

Prescription Medications. 1 month. You should keep at least one month's of prescription medication, in their original bottle, in your earthquake/disaster kit. Local pharmacy records are not likely to be available and reaching your doctor will be even less likely. Strongly consider more than one month's of medication for critical (heart, blood pressure, etc.) conditions. Although prescription insurance plans will not pay for this extra month's worth of medication, you can often get samples from your physician, or you can have your physician write a one month prescription that you fill without insurance by paying for the medication yourself.

Prescription Antibiotics. Because your health history needs to be taken in to account, consult with your physician as to what type of antibiotics you may need in a disaster/emergency setting. Most commonly, you would need antibiotics to cover for skin or soft tissue wounds and infections. During an actual disaster, and if at all possible, you should consult with neighbors who are physicians on whether or not to start the antibiotics as it is not advisable to start antibiotic treatment without first consulting a physician.

We hope that you will use this article not only to stock your first aid kit, but that you will also use it as a resource on how to properly use the items in your first aid kit. ## Nellie Gail Garden Group

What is Living soil? So many of you ask me how do I fix our clay soil here in Nellie Gail? And I will tell you what we can do but it will take some time and work. First off, Clay soil is not bad, it has minerals in it but the problem is its density. Add water to pure clay and you will see it becomes hard like clay.

"Clay particles are the smallest, are flat and are easily compacted. There is little to no space between them for air or water to flow. Slow to drain, dry out, or warm up, clay soil holds water well once it is wet—often to the point of being waterlogged." <a href="https://www.almanac.com/gardening-clay-soils#:~:text=Clay%20">https://www.almanac.com/gardening-clay-soils#:~:text=Clay%20</a> particles%20are%20the%20smallest,the%20point%20 of%20being%20waterlogged.

So pure clay soil causes root rot. When we over water our clay it literally chokes our plants. Notice what dies in a mudslide and you will see.

So what do we do to fix this and yes you can add sand to the mix; larger particles help create oxygen space. I use all purpose sand. Compost will also add decomposed organic material to the soil and help create an environment that feeds your trees.

What we need to begin with is added minerals such as Azomite or rock dust. https://www.redbudsoilcompany.com/blogs/the-redbud-blog/what-is-azomite-rock-dust-how-do-i-use-it

We also need NPK nitrogen, potassium and phosphorus. Nitrogen is a key component of photosynthesis. Phosphorus is all about root development and the production of flowers and fruits. Potassium is like the all-around MVP of nutrients. It helps regulate water balance, strengthens the plant's immune system, boosts resistance to diseases and pests, and improves the quality of fruits and vegetables. <a href="https://www.gardenbetty.com/npk-fertilizer/">https://www.gardenbetty.com/npk-fertilizer/</a>

What else do we need to grow plants in a clay environment? Mulch on top of your soil will also break down and decompose nutrients and really help retain water to the canopy or base of your plant. And that mulch can be old leaves (leaf mold is excellent to use) and it can be grass cuttings from mowing your yard. Mulch can be twigs and ground up plants from pruning your trees. Compost can also be a huge benefit to your garden. A compost pile is nothing more than rotting mulch, vegetables and fruit with added coffee grinds for nitrogen, eggshells for calcium and plant cuttings for NPK.

So what is living soil? Living soil is alive. If you dig into your soil you won't find anything alive. You might find a grub or two but the soil is pretty dead. Your roots may take up chemical nutrients but it won't have any benefits from living soil.







And why is that because when you feed your trees chemicals it will give your trees the NPK and you will see them turn green. But these chemicals do nothing for the oxygen your tree's roots need nor will it create a living environment that continues to feed your trees and most importantly prevents disease.

Now I know that is a lot to take in. What do you mean prevents disease? And here is the real reason living soil is the greatest thing you can do for your plants. Not only does it provide a feedback loop system in nutrients and oxygen. The living beneficial insects prevent disease.

Living soil is all about diversity. Diversity of fungi, bacteria, protozoa, nematodes, arthropods, and earthworms breaking down organic matter that produces nutrients for plants to use. https://drummersgardencenter.com/living-soil-what-is-it/#:~:text=Living%20soil%20is%20all%20about,soil%20healthy...a%20living%20soil!

So if you ask me how I know this works all I have to do is look at my trees, this year no aphids, no white

flies. And they can be a problem any time but we have tools to fight back. Worm composting the key to it all. Vermicomposting as it is called. Using Red Wriggler worms to compost they not only fight disease with their beneficial insects that reside in the soil along with the worms, they provide oxygen from their tunneling in the ground. They die and give nutrients and water from their bodies and they provide organic material for your trees and plants.

Vermicompost is the product of earthworm digestion and aerobic decomposition using the activities of micro- and macroorganisms at room temperature. Vermicomposting, or worm composting, produces a rich organic soil amendment containing a diversity of plant nutrients and beneficial microorganisms. https://rodaleinstitute.org/science/articles/vermicomposting-for-beginners/#:~:text=Vermicompost%20is%20 the%20product%20of,plant%20nutrients%20and%20 beneficial%20microorganisms.

So if you want to learn more about worm composting try it and reap the benefits of healthy trees and plants!!

Living soil is really getting back to what nature intended.

- 2. 1SMALL GARLIC CLOVE, MINCED (OPTIONAL)
- 3. JUICE OF 2 LARGE LEMONS, TO TASTE
- **4.** 3CUPS CHOPPED FRESH FLAT-LEAF PARSLEY (FROM 3 LARGE BUNCHES)
- 5. 1/4 CUP CHOPPED FRESH MINT
- 6. ½ POUND RIPE TOMATOES, VERY FINELY CHOPPED
- 7. 1BUNCH SCALLIONS, FINELY CHOPPED
- **8.** SALT, PREFERABLY KOSHER SALT, TO TASTE
- 9. <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>CUP EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL
- **10.** 1ROMAINE LETTUCE HEART, LEAVES SEPARATED, WASHED AND DRIED

#### PREPARATION:

- 1. PLACE BULGUR IN A BOWL, COVER WITH WATER (½ INCH ABOVE), SOAK FOR 20 MINUTES, DRAIN THROUGH CHEESECLOTH-LINED STRAINER, PRESS TO REMOVE EXCESS WATER. TRANSFER TO LARGE BOWL, MIX WITH GARLIC, LEMON JUICE, PARSLEY, MINT, TOMATOES, SCALLIONS, SALT. REST AT ROOM TEMPERATURE OR IN FRIDGE FOR 2-3 HOURS FOR BULGUR TO ABSORB AND SWELL.
- **2.** ADD OLIVE OIL, TOSS, ADJUST SEASONING, SERVE WITH LETTUCE LEAVES.


